

WILL YOU DARE TO LIVE THE LIFE YOU WANT?

LOOK AT LIFESTYLES AND CONSIDER WHAT'S IMPORTANT TO YOU



AIM

To make students aware of the wide range of career options available, and get them thinking about what interests them.

OBJECTIVES

- > To focus on the sports industry as a model to understand the abundance of opportunities available in the sector.
- > To research other industries and see if there are similarly wide-ranging opportunities.

RESOURCES NEEDED

TOOLS TO USE IN THE UCAS HUB

How many of you wanted to be a sports star when you were younger?

Perhaps your dreams of high-flying stardom and an equally high salary have been dashed, because you don't quite have the ability.

But don't think it's all over...

If you want to be involved in sport, or you have a talent in another sector where you'd like to get a job, just explore the possibilities.

Ask how many jobs they think are associated with sports. Reveal the numerous roles available within the sports industry.

TEACHING FOCUS ACTIVITY (Ten minutes – extend this part of the session if you have time)

In groups, ask students to investigate other industries and consider the wide range of options available.

Share and discuss what they've discovered.



EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Flip the activity to look at a job title - e.g. software developer - and see if there are opportunities to work across all industries.

PLENARY (Five minutes)

Encourage students to sign in to the Hub and explore what's out there. Suggest using the Explore tool to discover the wide range of subjects and different jobs they could lead to. They can also see suggested courses for them based on the subjects they're interested in using the 'For you' tab.



HOMEWORK

Continue to research options in whichever industry most appeals to you. Use the Explore tool on the Hub and favourite the subject areas that interest you most. Using your 'Notes' section on the Hub, write down what appeals to you most about that subject or industry you're interested in.
