
Applicants are still researching their options

Applicants are considering a range of sources, but university websites and virtual open days remains crucial






Resources and activities

Aside from your website and prospectus, students' reviews are very important





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

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

What do they want from virtual open days?

- Hearing from alumni and future applicants (feeling that 'fit')
- More subject-specific information
- More location information (campus and also more info about the general location)
- Information on sports, clubs and student support








What was most memorable at virtual open days?

- Really detailed subject information and sample lectures
- Those where it was easy to navigate the content or were innovative (eg welcoming video)
- Hearing from your students (past and present)
- Detailed info on accommodation (look, cost, location, options)
- Advice on how to apply and what that uni is looking for








Teaching quality is more important than local lockdowns, but many do want to remain local

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There are clear regional differences regarding the importance of location and proximity from home


Q: Have the recent reports of students in coronavirus-related lockdowns within their student halls had any impact on your choice of unis to apply to?
