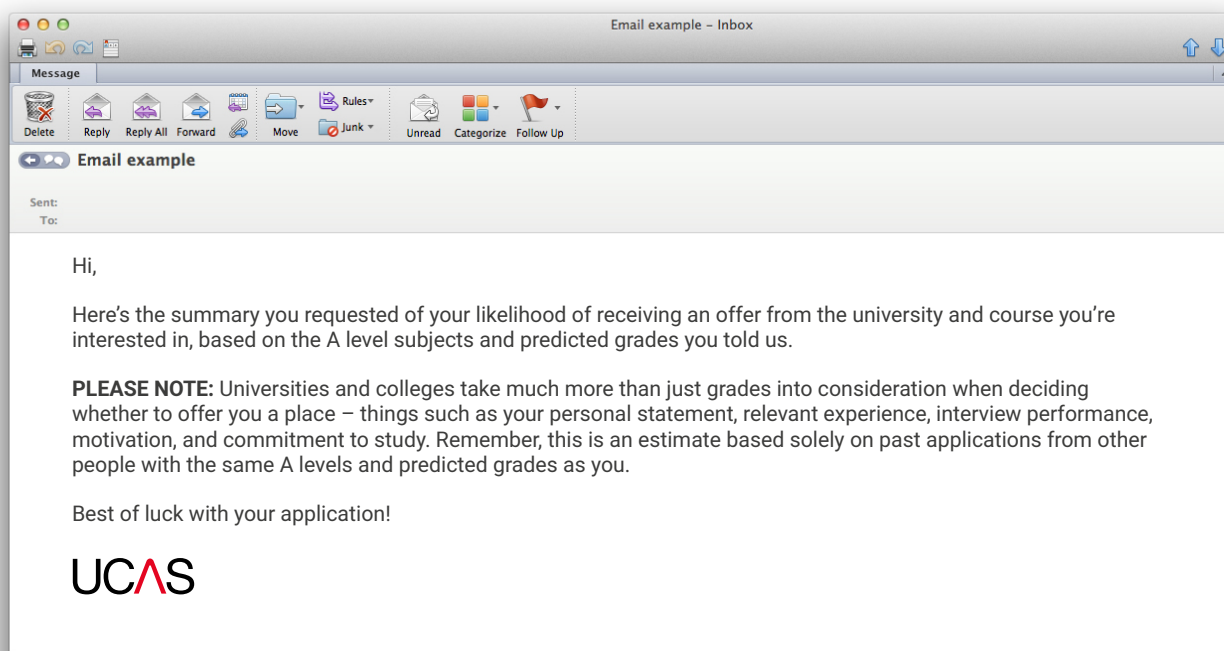

Your likelihood of receiving an offer

What you told us

Important things to note

- Universities and colleges take much more than just grades into consideration when deciding whether to offer you a place – things such as your personal statement, relevant experience, interview performance, your motivation, and commitment to study.
- Remember, this is just an estimate based solely on past applications from other people studying the same A levels and with the same predicted grades as you.

How could your likelihood of receiving an offer inform your decision-making?

If you think you could achieve higher than your predicted grades, the calculator will show you how achieving higher grades increases your percentage likelihood of receiving an offer. However, you need to be realistic – are you prepared and able to do the extra work to achieve those higher grades?

If there are courses you're really interested in that show a lower likelihood of receiving an offer, you could still consider applying. Alongside courses you are more confident about, consider being ambitious with one or two other choices. For example, you could apply to a university or course that sets more demanding entry requirements and is more competitive, where your likelihood of receiving an offer is lower but still worth trying for.

It is always a good idea to talk through your options and the choices you are considering with teachers, careers advisers, and your parents/carers before you apply.

How do we work out your chances of receiving an offer?

The percentage likelihood shown is based on the data we hold for UK 18 year old applicants to the UCAS Undergraduate scheme, from 2013 to 2016, who were studying three or more A levels. Where there are no historical applications with your exact combination of A level subjects and predicted grades, our system may calculate your chances of receiving an offer based on the data we do hold.

N.B. The results given by our offer rate calculator are based on historic data, which cannot provide a precise guide to future offers. Course leaders approach offer-making based on their estimates of the likelihood of the success of applicants with a range of A level achievement, as well as taking into account the likely demand for places on their course. Our offer rate calculator can therefore only serve as a guide, and we give no guarantee that the likelihood of you receiving an offer will be the likelihood predicted by the calculator.
