#### Conservatoire references for 2026

For the 2026 cycle, UCAS Conservatoire applicants will no longer be required to provide two references. Instead, they need to submit one referee, who will only be contacted if additional information is required by the Conservatoire.



### Local authority area changes

To adhere to current legislation, we've updated the local education authority options for the 'Student Support Arrangements' question in the application under the 'Finance and Funding' section. Moving forward applicants may need to select a different local education authority, using the updated help text. This will not impact how universities and colleges assess applications.
