COMMITMENT TO GOING TO UNIVERSITY REMAINS HIGH, BUT COST OF LIVING IS IMPACTING INTENTION

Cost of living impact on intention to go to university

Net: More likely 29% +13pp vs 2023



Somewhat more likely Much more likely

Net: Less likely 43% +9pp vs 2023

No difference

Somewhat less likely

Much less likely
