

CLEARING FORECAST 2026

METHODOLOGY

- Forecast created for expected 2026 Clearing size (applicants placed via Clearing).
- Based on January ECD applications data.
- Includes historic Decline My Place data for the first time.
- Model covers overall volumes plus UK regions, international, and major subject groups.



LAST CYCLE'S PREDICTIONS

- **More students met their Firm and Insurance choices**, resulting in fewer unplaced applicants on Results Day.

However;

- **Decline My Place usage rose slightly more than expected** and is now close to Main Scheme Clearing volumes.
- **More 18-year-olds entered via Direct to Clearing** than in the previous cycle.
- **Non-UK Clearing acceptances fell by less than expected** due to a surge in late applicants.

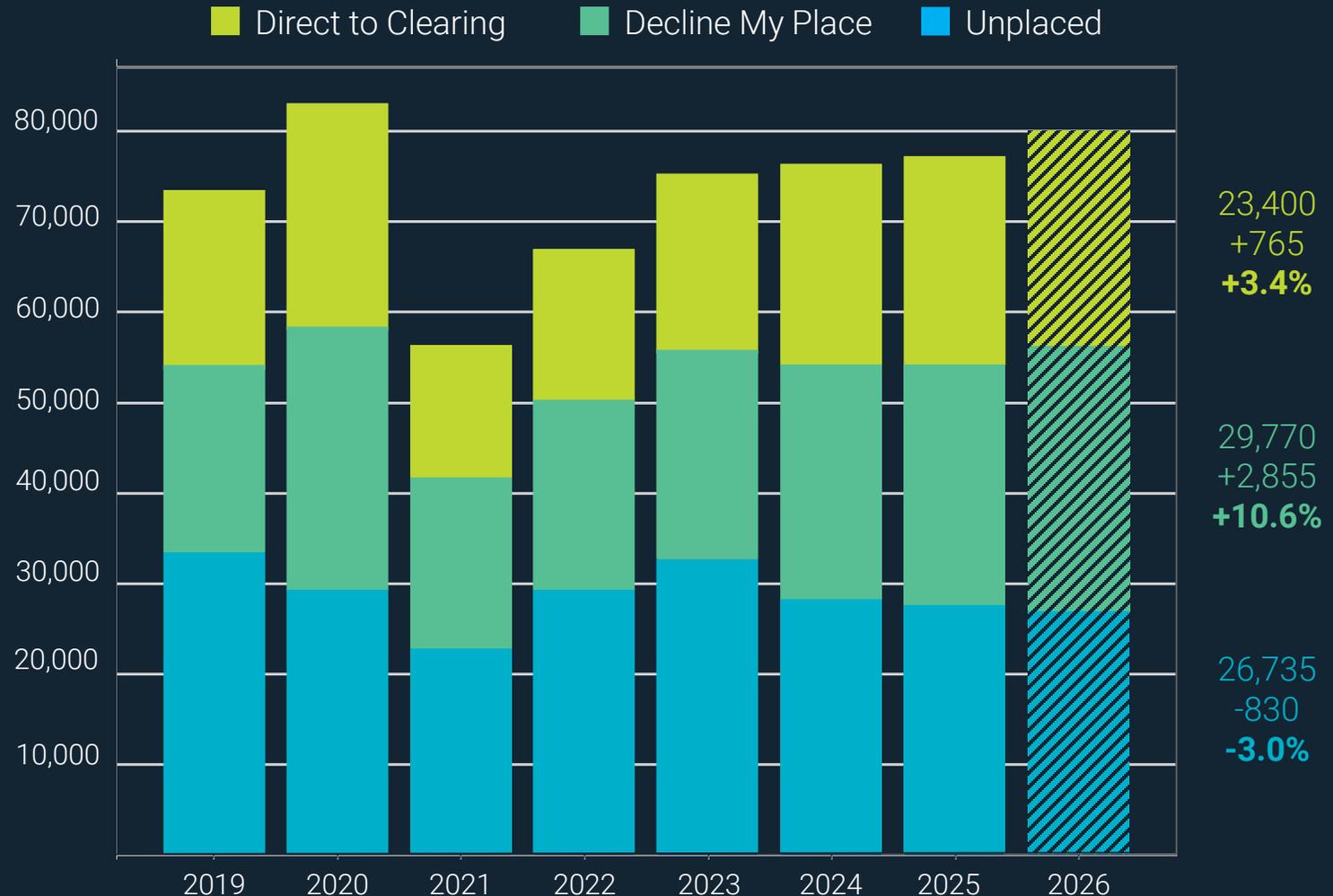

2026 FORECAST: OVERALL NUMBERS

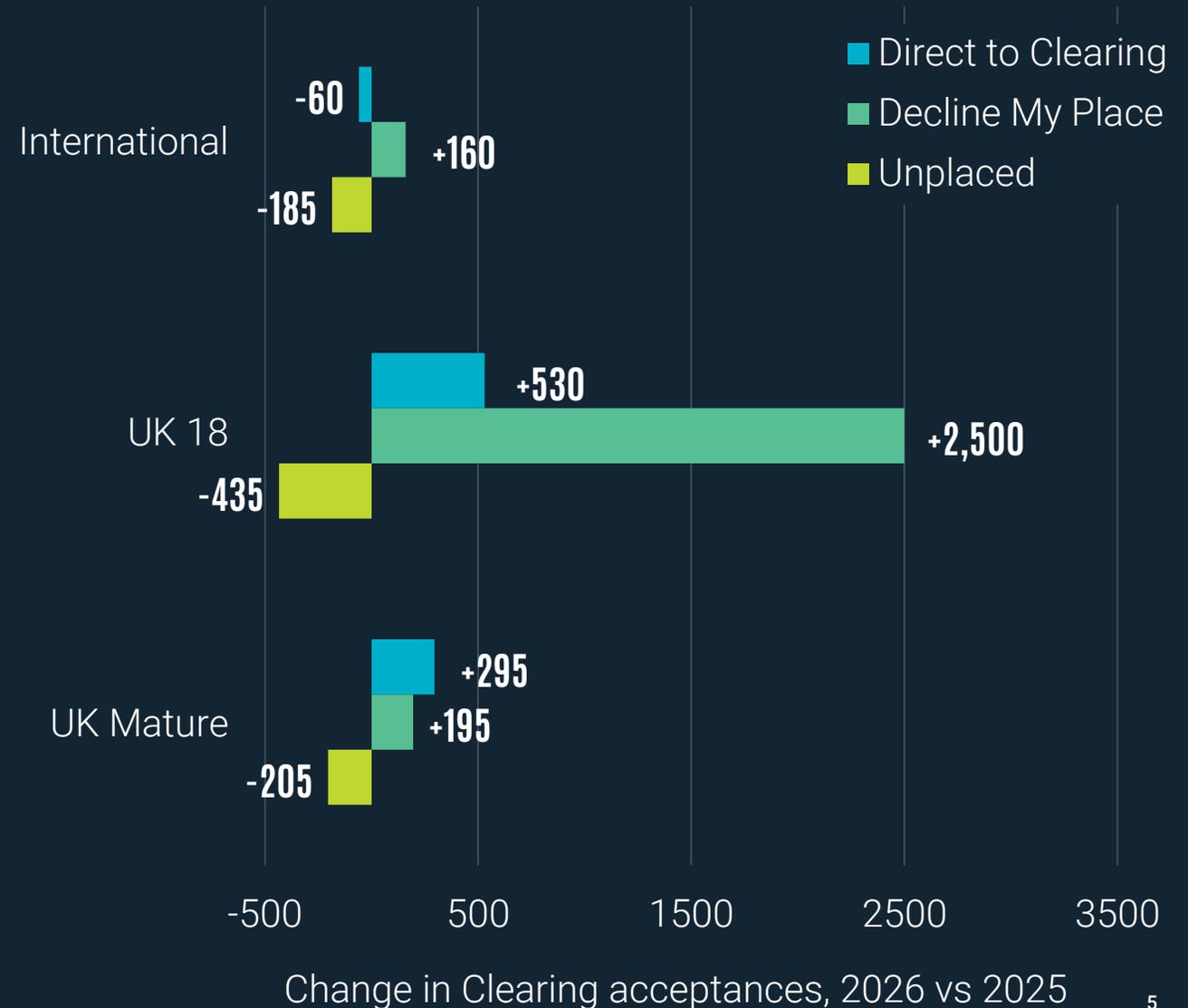

- At this stage, our forecast predicts Clearing will be almost 4% larger than last cycle.
- This is driven by an increase in January applications, as well as an expected growth for DTC.



DEMOGRAPHICS

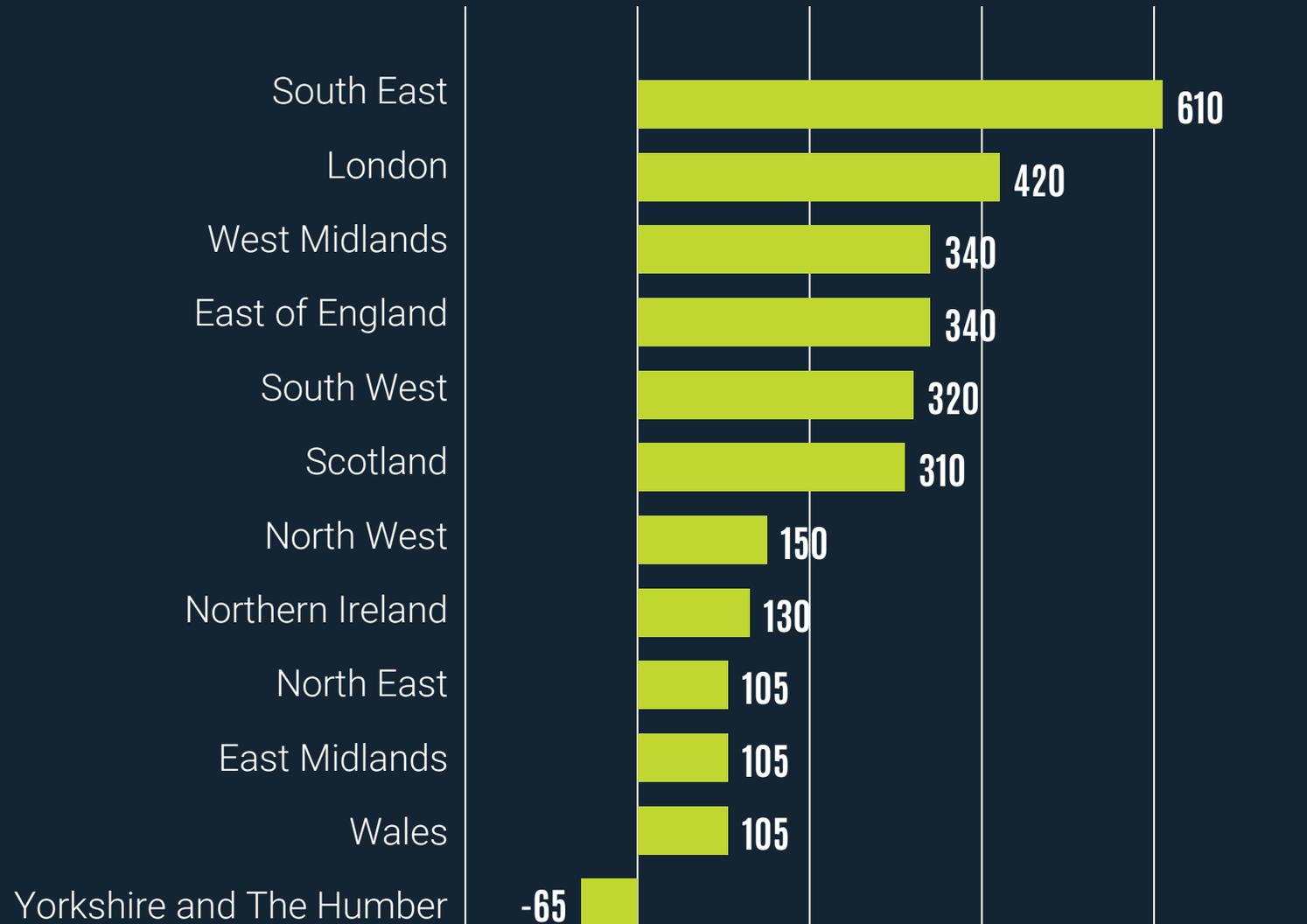
- The overall predicted increase is driven mainly by UK 18-year-old acceptances (+2,600 / +6.6%), most of these coming via Decline My Place.
- UK mature (19+) growth is small (+285 / +0.9%).
- International acceptances show a minor decline (-85 / -1.6%).



REGIONS

Regional predictions vary across the UK.

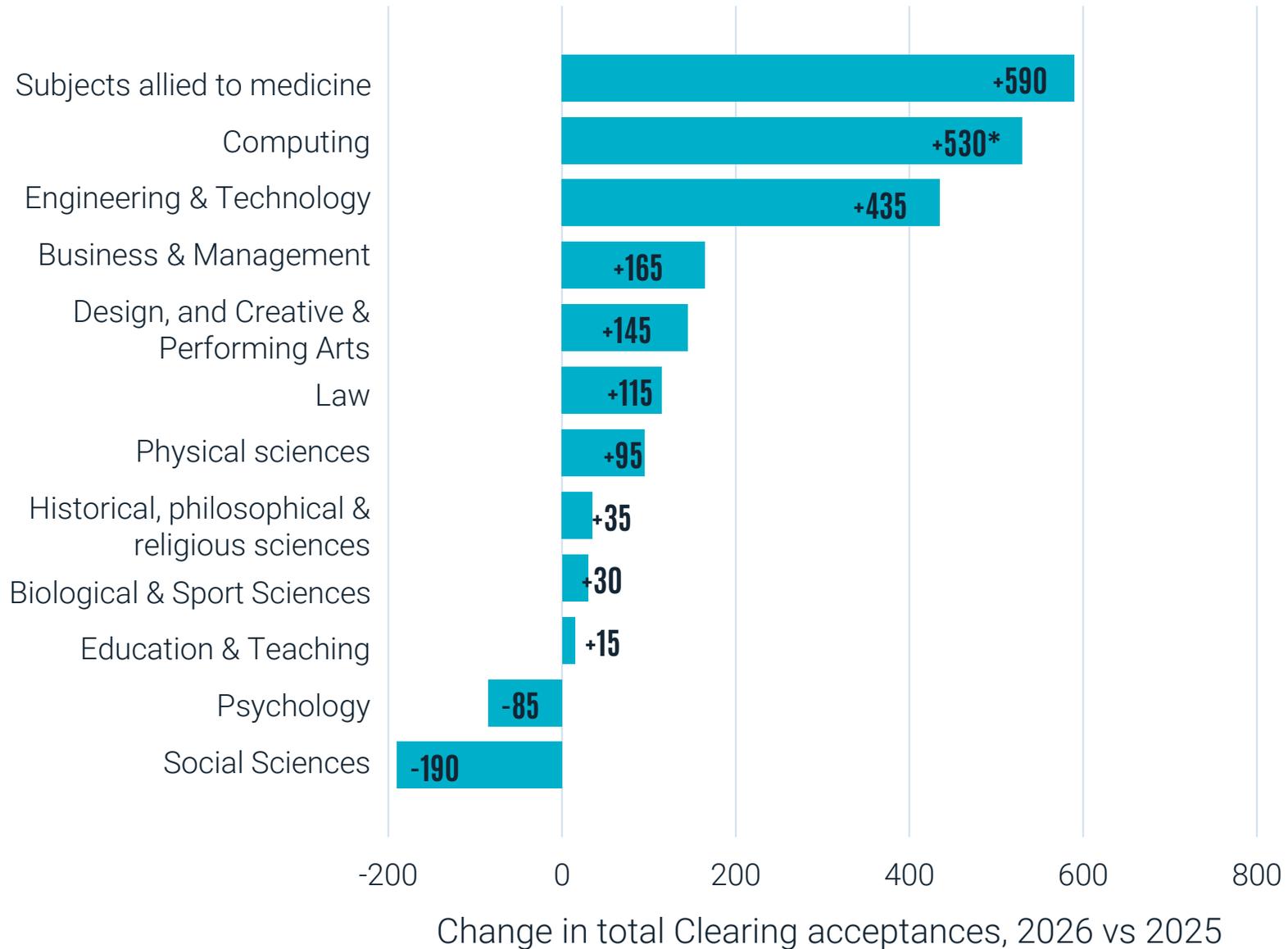
- The strongest growth is expected in the South East and London.
- Yorkshire & The Humber is the only region forecast to see a year-on-year decline.



Change in total Clearing acceptances, 2026 vs 2025

SUBJECTS

- Year-on-year changes for the largest CAH1 subject groups in Clearing are shown here.
- Subjects Allied to Medicine is expected to see the largest growth, while Social Sciences is forecasted to see a decline in Clearing volumes.



* Note the model takes long term trends into account, which may well be over-emphasising Computing's growth here.

DECLINE FIRM CHOICE

(59% of Decline My Place respondents)

Focus group findings

Want to change university only
Study the same course at a different university.

Want to change course/subject
Previous university is 'collateral damage' in the bid to find a new course, likely to look at local alternatives or those considered/applied to previously .

Likely driver:
choosing an option closer to home.

New course pull:
Have an alternative course they want to change to, potentially this was always a consideration.

Old course push:
Don't want to study the course they applied to or follow that career path so looking for an alternative course.

(30% of Decline My Place respondents)

Don't want to go to insurance choice
(57%)

Changed their mind about the subject
(21%)

DECLINE CHANGE OF COURSE

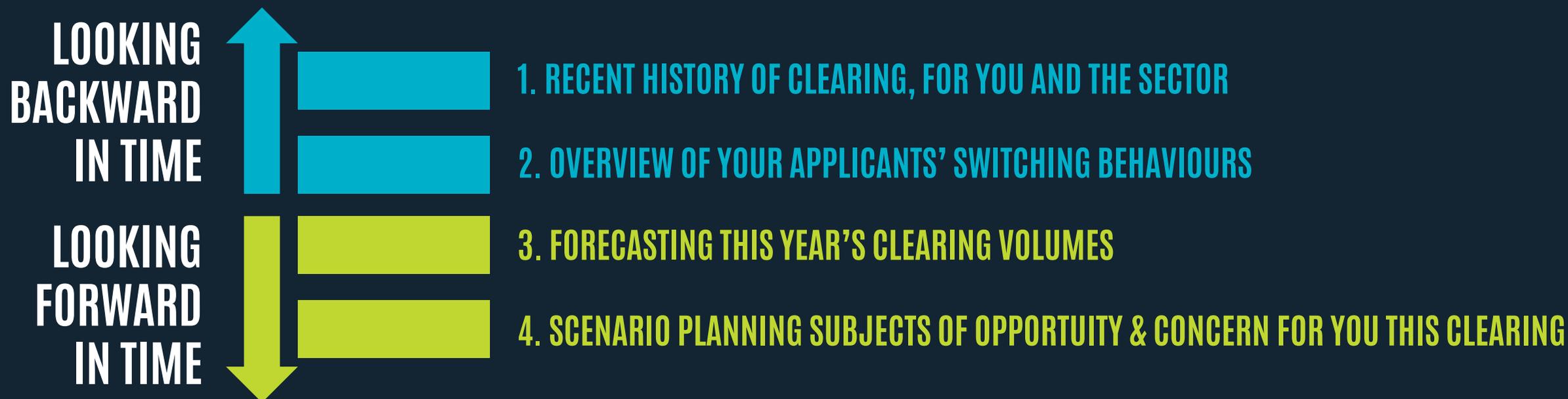
(10% of Decline My Place respondents)

PROVIDER CLEARING INSIGHTS

For these top five subject areas we have combined our predictions with your competitors' ECD position and the sector availability forecast to establish where competitiveness in clearing is likely to be highest.

Competition in clearer is higher if:

- Competitors received fewer application applications; or
- Sector availability is lower than other areas

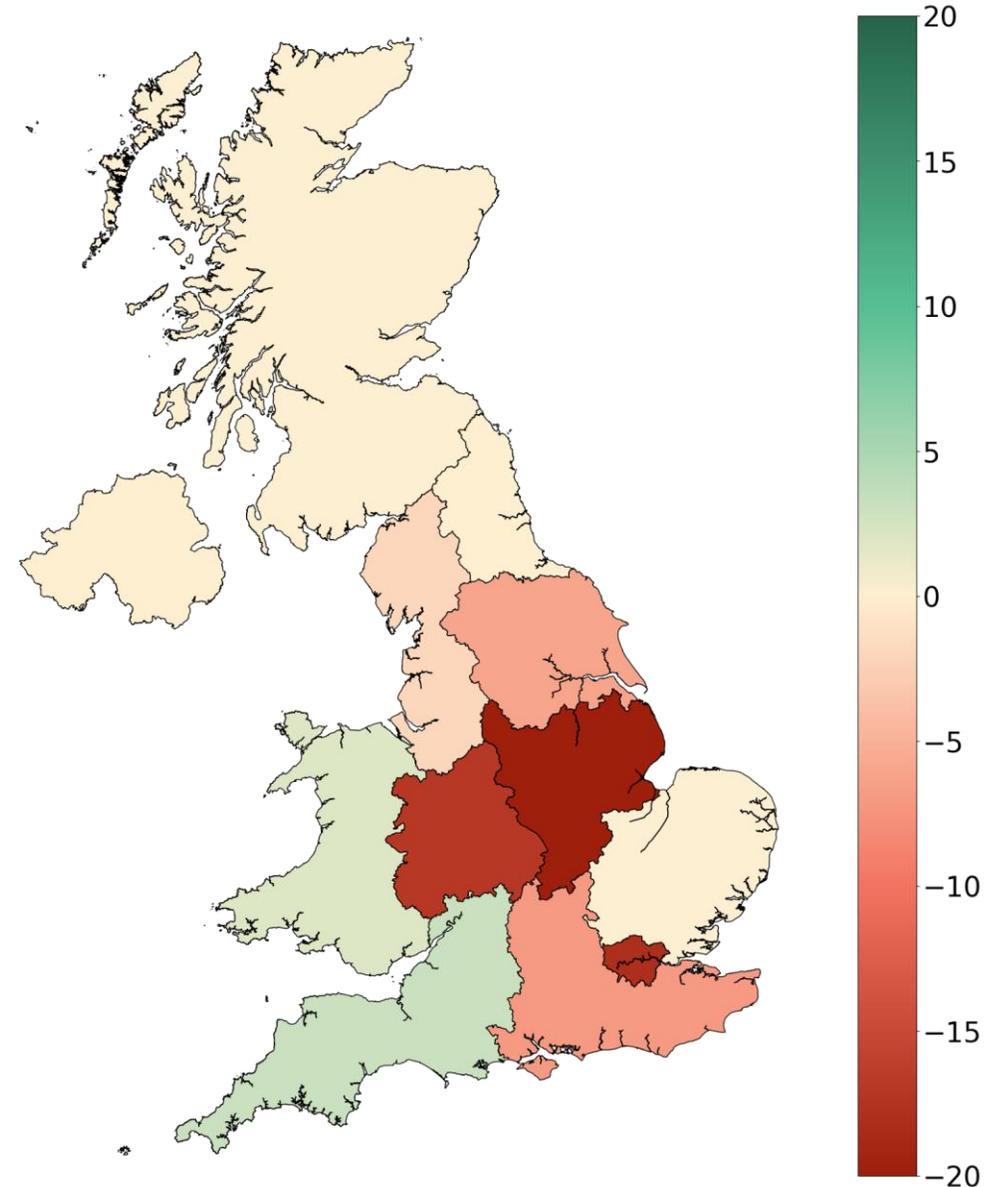

REGIONAL FOCUS

Switching applicant rates by Destination

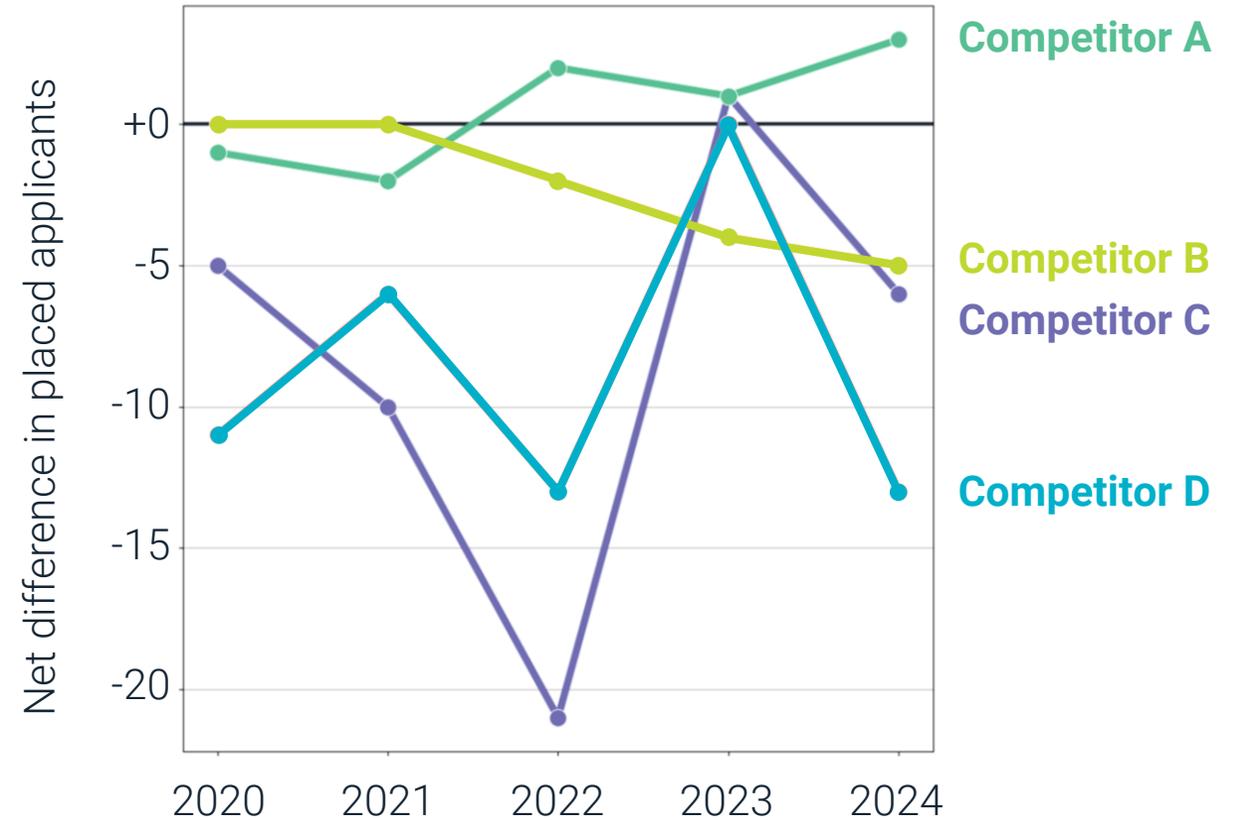
- Last cycle, you saw the largest net gain in switching applicants from providers in the South West (+3) and Wales (+2).
- On the other hand, you saw the largest net losses to HEPs in the East Midlands (-20), London (-18), and the West Midlands (-17).



COMPETITORS FOCUS

How have these trends changed in recent cycles?

- **Competitor D** made gains last cycle in switching applicants from you returning to 2022 levels.
- **Competitor C** increased their gains in applicants from you last cycle going from an overall gain in 2023.



SUMMARY: A BUSIER CLEARING EXPECTED OVERALL THIS CYCLE

- **2,800 additional applicants** to be placed in Clearing this cycle, vs 2025.
- This is largely driven by **increased January Deadline applications**.
- We also anticipate yet another cycle of **increased switching activity**, with those placed after self-releasing expected to rise over 10%.
- **All UK regions except for Yorkshire & Humber are expected to see more placed via Clearing this year**. The South East is forecast to have the highest volumes available in Clearing this year, by far.
- **Medicine, Engineering and Business** are expected to be the subjects with the highest Clearing volumes.
- We expect to see lower volumes of unplaced **Social Science & Psychology** applicants, and therefore those subjects are likely to be more competitive.
- Finally, we're expecting slightly less from international territories (though keep in mind potential for late appliers here).
