GETTING HERE



Travelling by car or coach?

Those travelling by car should enter the postcode G3 8YW into their satnav for the multi-storey car park. Leave the M8 at junction 19 and join the westbound Clydeside Expressway (A814). From the Expressway, take the exit for the Scottish Event Campus and turn left at the traffic lights. Take the right lane to access the multi-storey.


Coach drivers can drop off visitors at the west entrance to the Scottish Event Campus.



Where can I park my car?

Visitor parking is available on-site in the multi-storey car park (operated by City Parking LLP). The satnav postcode for this is G3 8YW.

Pay machines are on the ground floor, or level 2 of the car park. Payment can be made by cash or card on arrival, or before departure. For more information, please visit the <u>Scottish Event Campus website</u>. There is a height restriction of 2m.

Where can I park a coach or minibus?

Coach drivers can drop off visitors at the west entrance to the Scottish Event Campus. They will then be directed by traffic marshals to the coach park, where they can park free of charge until they pick up their visitors.



Travelling by public transport?

By Road:

Those travelling by car should enter the postcode G3 8YW into their satnay for the multi-storey. Leave the M8 at junction 19 and join the westbound Clydeside Expressway (A814). From the Expressway, take the exit for the Scottish Event Campus and turn left at the traffic lights. Take the right lane to access the multi-storey.

By Rail:

The Scottish Event Campus has its own dedicated railway station – Exhibition Centre – allowing easy access from the city centre and suburbs. There are six trains an hour, from Glasgow Central station, and the journey takes around three minutes. More information can be found on the Scottish Event Campus website.

By Bus

The Riversider 100 service operates from George Square in Glasgow city centre directly to the SEC. The X19 Stagecoach service operates near to the Scottish Event Campus, stopping on Finnieston Street only a few minutes' walk from the venue.

When you arrive

On arrival, please head up the boulevard to Hall 5, where you will see the UCAS signage. Please have your ticket ready for inspection. If you don't have a ticket, please report to the on-site registration desk.

Everyone will need to have pre-registered and have downloaded their ticket before they enter the venue. If you have issues with a cracked phone screen, please bring a printed copy of your ticket to be scanned.

Your exhibition ticket is personal to you and should not be passed on to other group members, as this could compromise the security of your data. To comply with data protection regulations, it's essential that individuals at our exhibitions use their own ticket – both on entering, and when visiting exhibitors' stands. Anyone found to be in breach of this will be asked to leave the event and register again to be readmitted.

Is there anywhere I can store my coat and bags?

Unfortunately, there isn't a cloakroom available.

What insurance is in place for the event?

The organiser has adequate public and employee liability cover. While the organisers take every precaution to protect visitors' property during an event, they are not responsible for any loss or damage. All group leaders should ensure they have adequate public and employers' liability cover, in line with the booking terms and conditions.

What happens to any lost property?

All property found in the exhibition hall will be handed in to the Scottish Event Campus security desk. Should any visitor lose an item, please come to the organiser's office to report it.

Can I smoke/vape on site?

The Scottish Event Campus operates a strict no smoking policy in the venue and would ask for your full cooperation in ensuring this is complied with. This includes e-cigarettes.

What security is there?

Security is provided for the show from 8 – 9 September 2025. The venue will conduct random bag searches and have a working sniffer dog in place for the duration of the event. Please do not be alarmed by these, they are standard practices for a venue of this size. If you are a victim of theft, please report it immediately to the organiser's office.
